1 Plaintiff The Tawnsaura Group, LLC ("Plaintiff") hereby alleges for its  
 2 Complaint against Anabolic Innovations, Inc. d/b/a A.I. Sports Nutrition ("Defendant"),  
 3 on personal knowledge as to its own activities and on information and belief as to the  
 4 activities of others, as follows:

### 5 **I. THE PARTIES**

6 1. Plaintiff is a limited liability company organized and existing under the  
 7 laws of Nevada, with a registered office at 50 West Liberty Street, Suite 1100, Reno,  
 8 Nevada 89501.

9 2. Plaintiff is the owner and assignee of United States Patent No. 5,874,471  
 10 ("the '471 patent") titled "Orthomolecular Medical Use of L-Citrulline for  
 11 Vasoprotection, Relaxative Smooth Muscle Tone and Cell Protection," and United  
 12 States Patent No. 6,028,107 ("the '107 patent") titled "Orthomolecular Medical Use of  
 13 L-Citrulline for Vasoprotection, Relaxative Smooth Muscle Tone and Cell Protection,"  
 14 and Plaintiff licenses the '471 patent and the '107 patent to at least one third-party and  
 15 is in negotiations to license the patents to numerous other parties.

16 3. Upon information and belief, Defendant Anabolic Innovations, Inc. d/b/a  
 17 A.I. Sports Nutrition is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Florida  
 18 with a principal place of business at 5337 North Socrum Loop Road in Lakeland,

### 20 **II. JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

21 4. This is an action for patent infringement arising under the patent laws of  
 22 the United States, Title 35 of the United States Code. Accordingly, this Court has

8 contains the ingredient l-citrulline in place of or in addition to "L-Citrulline AKG."

9 8. Defendant has committed the tort of patent infringement within the State  
10 of California, and more particularly, within the Central District of California, by virtue  
11 of the fact that Defendant has shipped, distributed, offered for sale, sold, and advertised,  
12 and continues to ship, distribute, offer for sale, sell, and advertise the infringing product  
13 Maniac.

### 14 **IV. FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

#### 15 **Infringement of U.S. Patent No. 5,874,471**

16 9. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges the allegations of the foregoing paragraphs  
17 of this Complaint as if fully set forth herein.

18 10. Defendant has in the past and still is literally infringing or infringing under  
19 the doctrine of equivalents, directly and indirectly through contributory and/or induced  
20 infringement, one or more claims of the '471 patent by making, using, selling, and  
21 offering for sale nutritional supplements embodying the patented invention, and will  
22 continue to do so unless enjoined by this Court.

23 11. Defendant's activities have been without express or implied license by  
24 Plaintiff.

25 12. On information and belief, the infringement by Defendant has been and

12           17. Defendant has in the past and still is literally infringing or infringing under  
13 the doctrine of equivalents, directly and indirectly through contributory and/or induced  
14 infringement, one or more claims of the '107 patent by making, using, selling, and  
15 offering for sale nutritional supplements embodying the patented invention, and will  
16 continue to do so unless enjoined by this Court.

17           18. Defendant's activities have been without express or implied license by  
18 Plaintiff.

19           19. On information and belief, the infringement by Defendant has been and  
20 continues to be willful.

21           20. As a result of Defendant's acts of infringement, Plaintiff has suffered and

### 3 **VI. THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION**

#### 4 **Tortious Interference with Prospective Economic Advantage**

5 23. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges the allegations of the foregoing paragraphs  
6 of this Complaint as if fully set forth herein.

7 24. At all relevant times, Plaintiff has licensed the patents to at least one  
8 manufacturer of dietary supplements. Plaintiff, as exclusive owner of the rights  
9 embodied in the patents, also has prospective licensing relationships with numerous  
10 other manufacturers and distributors of dietary supplements that contain citrulline.

11 25. Defendant has both actual and constructive knowledge of the preceding  
12 potential economic relationships. Defendant has constructive knowledge of Plaintiff's  
13 patents and the exclusive rights embodied therein because they are matters of public  
14 record. Defendant also has actual knowledge of Plaintiff's patents and the rights  
15 embodied therein because Defendant has chosen to knowingly infringe the patents  
16 rather than license the patents from Plaintiff and pay Plaintiff a reasonable royalty  
17 thereon.

18 26. Defendant's intentional wrongful acts have disrupted the prospective  
19 economic relationship between Plaintiff and other potential licensees. Specifically,  
20 other manufacturers of dietary supplements - that are competitors of defendant - have  
21 declined to enter into licensing relationships with Plaintiff because those competitors  
22 are aware that Defendant is infringing Plaintiff's patents instead of paying Plaintiff a  
23 reasonable royalty thereon; as such, those potential licensees would be at a competitive  
24 disadvantage to defendant by licensing (and paying for) the rights to Plaintiff's patents  
25 that defendant is simply infringing and not paying.

26 27. Plaintiff has suffered economic harm proximately caused by the acts of the  
27 Defendant.

1 **VII. PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

2 WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for entry of judgment against Defendant as  
3 follows:

4 1. A declaration that Defendant has infringed the '471 patent and the '107  
5 patent under 35 U.S.C. §§ 271 *et seq.*;

6 2. A declaration that Defendant has tortiously interfered with Plaintiff's  
7 prospective economic advantages;

8 3. That injunctions, preliminary and permanent, be issued by this Court  
9 restraining Defendant, its respective officers, agents, servants, directors, and employees,  
10 and all persons in active concert or participation with each, from directly or indirectly  
11 infringing, or inducing or contributing to the infringement by others of, the '471 patent  
12 and the '107 patent;

13 4. That Defendant be required to provide to Plaintiff an accounting of all  
14 gains, profits, and advantages derived by Defendant's infringement of the '471 patent  
15 and the '107 patent, and that Plaintiff be awarded damages adequate to compensate  
16 Plaintiff for the wrongful infringing acts by Defendant, in accordance with 35 U.S.C. §  
17 284;

18 5. That the damages awarded to Plaintiff with regard to the '471 patent and  
19 the '107 patent be increased up to three times, in view of Defendant's willful  
20 infringement, in accordance with 35 U.S.C. § 284;

21 6. That this case be declared to be exceptional in favor of Plaintiff under 35  
22 U.S.C. § 285, and that Plaintiff be awarded its reasonable attorneys' fees and other  
23 expenses incurred in connection with this action;

24 7. That Plaintiff be awarded its interest and costs of suit incurred in this  
25 action;

26 8. Compensatory damages;

27 9. Punitive damages; and




